Highlands Region

- Total area: 859,267 acres (approximately 1,343 square miles).
- Provides drinking water for 70% of New Jersey residents.
- Highlands Act, passed in 2004, divided region into Preservation Area and Planning Area.
- Approximately 415,000 acres in the Preservation Area.
- Approximately 444,000 acres in the Planning Area.
- Development is more strictly regulated in the Preservation Area than the Planning Area.

Highlands Communities

- 88 municipalities (within 7 counties) have lands within the Highlands Region.
- 47 have lands in both Planning and Preservation Areas.
- 36 have lands only in the Planning Area.
- 5 have lands only within the Preservation Area.

Plan Conformance

- Highlands Act requires counties and municipalities to align local master plans and development regulations with the Highlands Regional Master Plan (RMP) for Preservation Area lands.
- Conformance for Planning Area lands is voluntary.

Municipal & County Plan Conformance Petitions and Approvals (As of March 2018)

- 61 of the 88 municipalities in the Region have submitted Petitions for Plan Conformance, indicating their intent to conform with the RMP (69%). Of the 61 submitted, 50 have been approved by the Highlands Council (82%).
 - 31 petitions include only Preservation Area lands (26 approved)
 - 20 petitions include Preservation and Planning Area lands (18 approved)
 - 10 are from municipalities that have only Planning Area lands (6 approved)
- Of the 61 municipalities petitioning, 30 have chosen to voluntarily include planning area lands (49%).
- 5 of the 7 counties in the Region have submitted Petitions for Plan Conformance, all conforming for Preservation Area lands only. Of the 5 petitions, 2 have been approved by the Highlands Council.

Timeline of Highlands Act and Regional Master Plan

- 1992 U.S. Forest Service issues a report on the New York and New Jersey Highlands, which serves as an impetus for efforts to protect the natural resources of the New Jersey Highlands.
- 2002 U.S. Forest Service study is updated, finding an 11 percent increase in population in the New York and New Jersey Highlands Region from 1990 to 2000.
- 2004 The Highlands Water Protection and Planning Act is enacted by the State of New Jersey (August) and the Federal Highlands Conservation Act is signed into law (November).
- 2008 The New Jersey Highlands Regional Master Plan (RMP) is approved by the Highlands Council and becomes effective.
- 2014 The Highlands Council commences its first-ever review of the RMP with launch of the RMP Monitoring Program.
- 2017 The Highlands Council releases a Fiscal Impact Assessment and a Draft Monitoring Program Recommendation Report (MPRR).
